EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

Exhibitors and handlers are required to clean up any fouling by dog(s) in their charge.

Exhibitors are also reminded that they are responsible for the actions and any damage done by their children or children in their charge within the environs of the show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. OPENING OF SHOW: The show opens at 08:30 am.
2. RECEIPT OF DOGS: Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. JUDGING TIME: Judging will commence at 09:30 am for the breed.
4. CLOSE OF SHOW: The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS: Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed.
6. ENTRY FEES: **Members first entry per dog £10.00 subsequent entries with same dog £2.00. Non-members first entry per dog £12.00 subsequent entries with same dog £3.00**
7. **PRIZE MONEY: Prize money will not be paid at this show.**
8. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. PUPPIES: Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition. Puppies over 4 months but under six months on the first day of the show may enter Not For Competition.
10. MATING OF BITCHES: The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is strictly forbidden.
11. COOKING STOVES: The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Manager.
12. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW: Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it shall automatically be Best Puppy in Show retrospectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult, it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show retrospectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Withdrawal from Competition. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may withdraw from all other competition prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso: For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. BEST IN SHOW: The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. Withdrawal from Competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best in Show. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition for which it was previously eligible. Proviso: For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
14. ADMISSION TO BEST IN SHOW: Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the last announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
15. SCHEDULE AMENDMENTS: No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by an advertisement on the Canine Press wherever possible.
16. AUTHORITY TO COMPETE: All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. Dogs in cars on hot days: Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the Do's and Don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events:
 - a. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - b. If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - c. The vehicle should be as ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink.
 - d. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around your dog.
 - e. When at the show—never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - f. Keep the dog in the shade—take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - g. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
 - h. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

i. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

18. NOT FOR COMPETITION: Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of dogs so entered must be recorded on the entry form and all such dogs must be Kennel Club registered.
19. PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION: All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (B) - regarding preparation of dogs for exhibition.
20. REGULATIONS: The show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. All rules, definitions or instructions of the nature of rules and regulations printed for convenience in other parts of the schedule shall be deemed to be the regulations of this show and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these.
21. RECEIPT OF ENTRIES: Correctly postmarked entries received after 14th August 2010 will be accepted but may not be included in the catalogue, due to the printing schedule. If acknowledgement of entry is required, a stamped, addressed postcard with the word RECEIPT written on the reverse side must be enclosed. ONCE ENTRIES ARE RECEIVED THEY ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.
22. RETURNED CHEQUES: Exhibitors whose cheques are returned by their bank for any reason will be liable to settle the amounts due, including a bank charge fee of £10.00.
23. EXCLUSION OF DOGS: The Show Management may exclude or remove any dog which, in their opinion or that of the judge, is not in a fit state for exhibition.
24. SAFETY OF DOGS: The committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any dog, person or property whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever, or from any act of omission of itself, its officers, servants, agents, or others or the damage done by the exhibitor to any person or property,.
25. NOT FOR COMPETITION: a "Not for Competition" class is scheduled for dogs not being exhibited at this show. Fee per dog is £2.00 Members, £3.0 Non-members.
26. PASSES: No passes will be issued for this show
27. CATALOGUES: will be provided at a charge of £2.00 each and must be ordered at time of entry. A small number will be offered for sale on the day at £3.00 each.
28. GANGWAYS: must be kept clear at all times. Any obstructions including dog boxes left in gangways will be removed by the show management.
29. ORDER OF JUDGING: will be as published in the schedule.
30. PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING: cannot take place in the ring whilst judging is in progress. Specific dogs may only be photographed with the permission of the exhibitor. Flash photography will be allowed unless it is affecting exhibits in the ring at which time a ring steward or the judge is empowered to request the activity is ceased. Film and television equipment may only be used with permission of the show management.
31. CAR PARKING: DOGS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO BE LEFT IN CARS AND THIS IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY. Un-entered dogs will not be permitted onto the show ground unless they are entered "not for competition".
32. MEMBERSHIP: Is open to all. Forms can be obtained from the club website or Membership Secretary.
33. FOULING: Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show and within the environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
34. OWNER RESPONSIBILITY: The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst under at the licensed venue, including its environs and approaches.
35. DISQUALIFICATION: A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
36. MOBILE PHONES: The use of mobile phones and paging devices will not be permitted within any judging ring and their use at the ringside may be restricted at the discretion of the Show Officials.
37. RING NUMBER: Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst their dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
38. CHANGE OF JUDGE: It is the policy of the Club not to refund entry fees or settle expenses if a change of judge is required in an emergency.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following Definition, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e., 7th September 2010.

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal—The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) Transfer—a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is overage but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY:	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age in the first day of the Show.
PUPPY:	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR:	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
YEARLING:	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar of age on the first day of the Show.
NOVICE:	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open or Championship shows (Puppy, Special Puppy, minor Puppy, & Special Minor Puppy classes excepted) whether restricted or not.
POST GRADUATE:	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.
LIMIT:	For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship shows in Limit or Open classes where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.
OPEN:	For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
VETERAN:	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.
NOT FOR COMPETITON:	Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

DOGS DIE IN HOT CARS - PLEASE READ ME

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the 'do's and don't's' of travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events:

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put the dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
